SPRING RALLY 95

THE SPRING RALLY WAS PRESENTED BY THE SCCA ON APRIL 9, 193. THE WEATHER WAS THE STORY, AND IT WAS MOST DEFINITELY NOT "SPRING" LIKE. ON MY WAY OUT TO THE LIVONIA STARTING POINT TWO HOURS BEFORE THE EVENT, A HEAVY RAIN BEGAN FALLING. THE MURPHYS WOULD CERTAINLY NOT BE PERFORMING THEIR CHECKPOINT DUTIES FROM LAWN CHAIRS SET UP IN THE BED OF THEIR PICKUP AS THEY HAD LAST YEAR. THE RADIO WAS PREDICTING MORE RAIN WITH A CHANCE OF FLURRIES. AS JOHN AND I WERE GOING OVER THE MYRIAD FINAL DETAILS OF THE EVENT AT THE NEARBY MCDONALDS, THE RAIN CHANGED TO SERIOUS SNOW AS THE TEMPERATURE PLUMMETED. THIRTY MINUTES BEFORE THE START THE SEVERITY OF THE STORM(THREE INCHES OF SNOW AND WIND CHILL OF 10 DEGREES) BEGAN TO THE SEVERAL OTHER CREWS WHO SAID THEY WERE COMING DECIDED NOT TO COMPETE, AND ONLY FOUR CARS HAD REGISTERED. FORTUNATELY BOB FOREN SHOWED UP WILLING TO WORK CONTROLS, AND A NUMBER OF COMPETITORS DELAYED BY THE WEATHER SHOWED UP DURING THE LAST HALF HOUR BEFORE THE START.

IT WAS DECIDED WE WOULD "PRESS ON" WITH THE EVENT, BUT IT WOULD HAVE TO BE RUN UNDER EMERGENCY SPEEDS 20 PERCENT SLOWER THAN ORIGINALLY PLANNED. EVEN WITH THAT PRECAUTION I WAS CONCERNED ABOUT SAFETY. RALLY VETERANS LES TALCOTT AND RANDY WITTINE SHOWED UP, BUT DECIDED THE CONDITIONS WERE TOO SEVERE AND LEFT WITHOUT REGISTERING. TWELVE CARS STARTED, CONSISTING OF THREE EQUIPPED, THREE LIMITED, AND SIX NOVICE TEAMS.

THE RALLY WAS RUN BETWEEN LIVONIA AND ANN ARBOR. TOUR RALLY RULES WERE MODIFIED TO ACCOMMODATE BOTH NUMBERED AND LETTERED INSTRUCTIONS. THIS ALLOWED THE ORGANIZERS TO USE SMALL TIMING TRAPS ASSOCIATED WITH SIGNS AND LANDMARKS TO KEEP THE COMPUTER CLASS CARS BUSY, AND YET ALLOW THE NOVICE CLASS CARS TO PRACTICE FINDING TRAPS WITHOUT THE LARGE PENALTIES USUALLY ASSOCIATED WITH MISSING THEM ON SERIOUS TRAP RALLIES.

CONVERTING ALL THE SPEEDS AND PAUSES INTO EMERGENCY SPEEDS WAS THE BIGGEST CHORE FACING THE NAVIGATORS, AND SIMPLY KEEPING THE CAR ON THE ROAD WAS ENOUGH TO KEEP THE DRIVERS BUSY. JIM MICKLE AND NEW DRIVER SCOTT KRAFT PROVED TO BE THE BEST AT FIGURING OUT THE EMERGENCY SPEED CORRECTION, TOOK THE EARLY LEAD, AND EVENTUALLY THE OVERALL WIN. GENE HENDERSON AND JOHN PUFFENBERGER FAILED TO APPLY EMERGENCY SPEEDS TO THE ODOMETER CHECK, AND ENDED THEIR CHANCES FOR A WIN. MARK HENDERSON AND JOHN WICKINS FIGURED IT OUT DURING LUNCH AND HAD BY FAR THE BEST SEE ALL THE NOVICES FINISHED THE EVENT IN SPITE OF THE WEATHER. THE TEAM OF JOE AND VERONIQUE BROWNE HAD THE LEAD UNTIL THE LAST CONTROL, WHEN THE KENT YOUNG AND MARLENA BAERKIRCHER CHEVETTE CHARGED INTO THE LEAD FOR THE CLASS WIN.
